

The Military and the Industrial Complex

William Hartung will address the Deerfield Progressive Forum on “The Military and the Industrial Complex” on January 27, 2007.

He is an internationally recognized expert on the issues of arms trade and the economics of military spending as well as an expert in American foreign policy. He is also the director of the Arms Trade Research Center and a President’s Fellow at the World Policy Institute.

He is the author or co-author of numerous books and studies including “The Changing Dynamics of US Defense Policy” and “Budgeting in the Post Cold War Era” (co-author); “Welfare For Weapons Dealers 1988: The Hidden Costs of NATO Expansion” (World Policy Institute, 1998); *US Weapons at War* (World Policy Institute, 1995); and “Weapons for All” (1994). His articles on the arms trades and the economics of defense spending have appeared in the *New York Times*, *Newsday*, the *Nation*, the *Christian Science Monitor*, the *Bulletin of Atomic Scientists*, the *World Policy Journal* and other publications.

Hartung is a member of the International Studies Association and a recipient of a research and writing grant from the Program on International Peace and Cooperation of the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation.

His experience includes serving as director of the Project on the Control of the International Arms Trade at the World Policy Institute; research associate and project director at the New York based Council on Economic Priorities; and speech writer and analyst for New York State Attorney General Robert Abrams.

He has also made guest appearances on national television and radio programs including CBS’ 60 Minutes, NBC Nightly News, the MacNeill/Leher Report, CNN’s Inside Business and National Radio’s Talk of the Nation. Cyndee Pattison
