

Revisiting Nuclear Power

Karl Grossman, who has spent his 40-year career combining his investigative reporting skills and environmental journalism in a variety of media, will make a presentation to the Deerfield Progressive Forum titled, “Revisiting Nuclear Power,” on March 7, 2009. A full professor of journalism at the State University of New York – College at Old Westbury and coordinator of the Media and Communications Major at the college, he is the host of the nationally syndicated television program “Enviro Close-Up,” the narrator and host of award-winning TV documentaries on environmental and energy issues, and the author of six books.

He serves as a program host and writer of TV documentaries produced by New York-based Enviro Video, which include the award winning, “Three Mile Island Revisited,” “Nukes in Space: The Nuclearization and Weaponization of the Heavens,” and “The Push to Revive Nuclear Power.” Formerly an investigative reporter for the “Long Island Press,” a major daily newspaper serving metropolitan New York, he is chief investigative reporter for WVVH-TV on Long Island.

Dr. Grossman is currently on the Advisory Board of the Action Committee to Stop the Cassini Earth Flyby; NASA’s Cassini space probe is a space ship that travels at record speeds (more than 10 miles per second) and carries more than 72 pounds of radioactive plutonium. He has also received the George Polk, James Aronson, and Peter Zenger Awards for investigative reporting.
